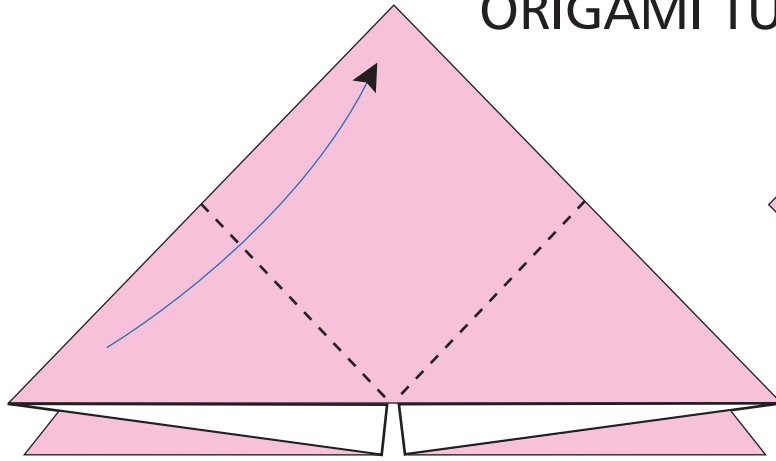
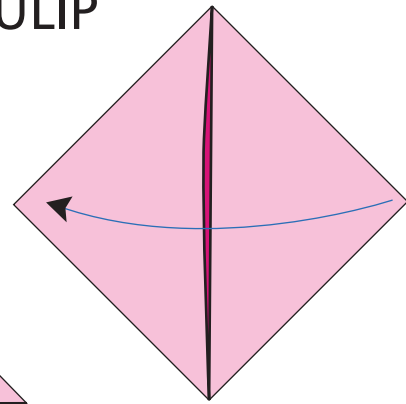


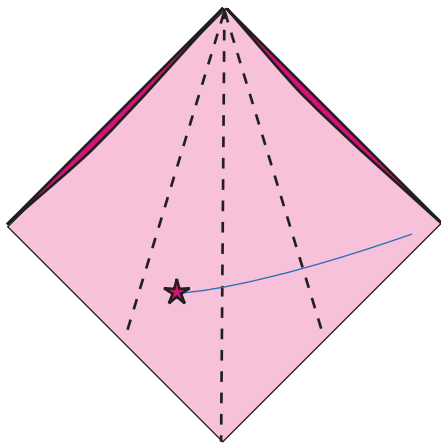
ORIGAMI TULIP



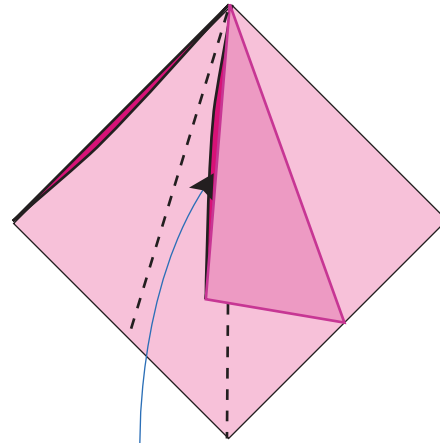
Fold the corner to the top along the dotted line, on both sides, then turn the shape over and repeat.



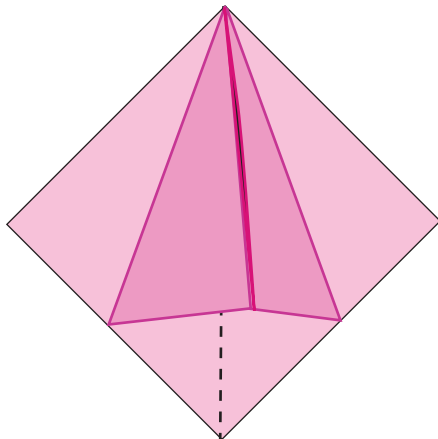
Turn the 'page'



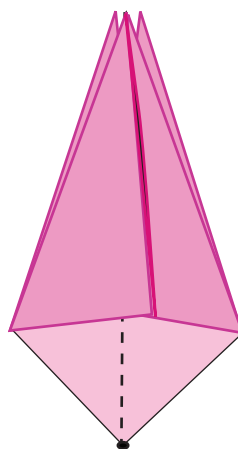
Fold the corner to overlap the centreline.



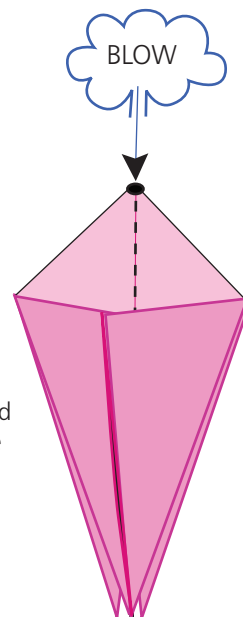
Opening to tuck 2nd flap into.



Repeat on the opposite corner and tuck each flap into the first flap.



Do the same on the other side and then enlarge the hole on the base with a pencil point so that it is about 2-3mm in diameter.



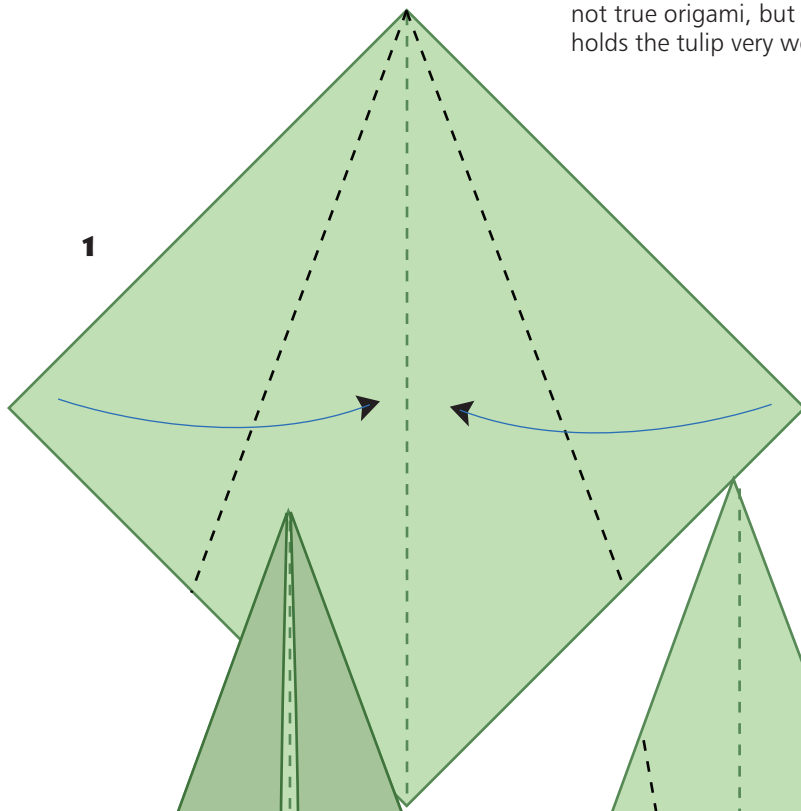
Turn upside down, tuck your fingers gently into the overlapping flaps and blow with a good puff to inflate the tulip. The base will go flattish.

Turn it back the right way around.
Peel the petals back carefully so
that they curve slightly.

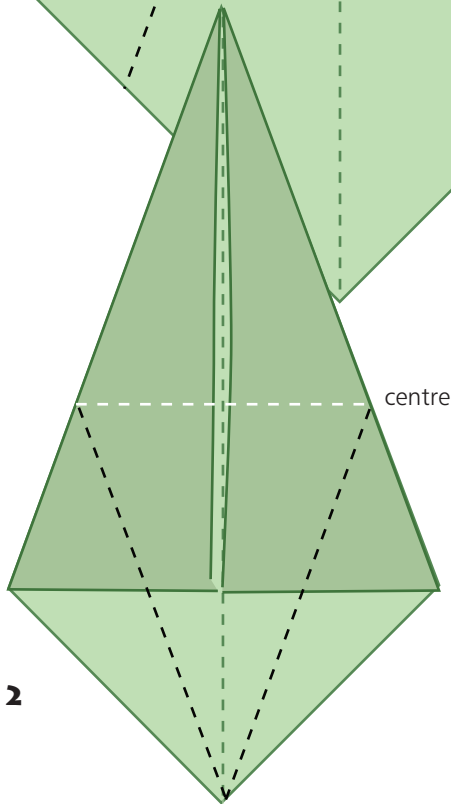
Dip a bamboo kebab
stick into PVA glue
and insert it into the
hole and up to
the top of the tulip.
The excess glue
around the hole
will glue it nicely.

Lastly, slip the stick
through the punched
hole on the outside,
wrap the leaf around
the stick at the base
and secure with
sticky tape or glue.

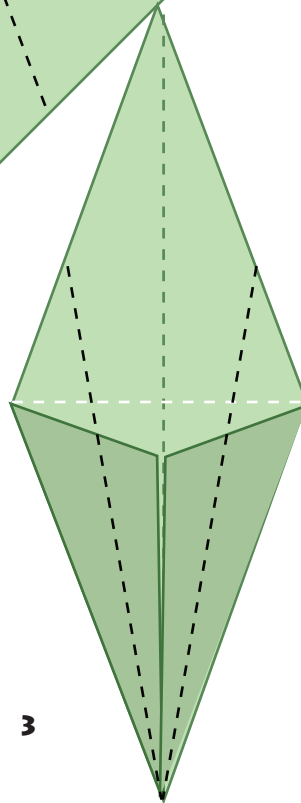
Using a stick and glue is
not true origami, but it
holds the tulip very well!



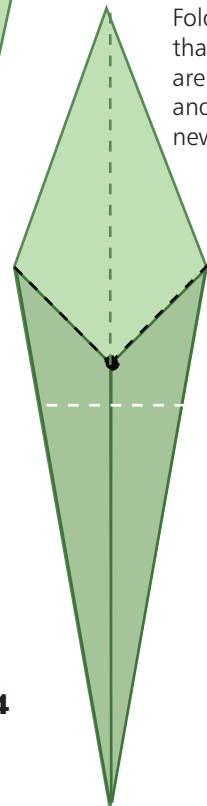

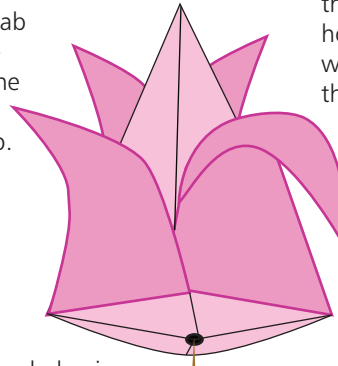
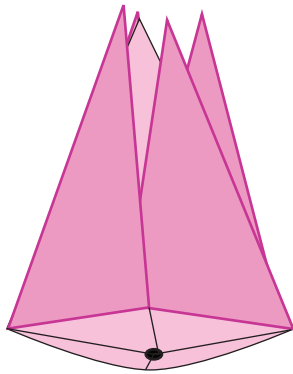
